

Geography

At Paganel through the school's delivery of a broad and balanced curriculum the geographical knowledge and skills outlined in the National Curriculum (2014) are taught discretely to our children within the context of a range of exciting and engaging topics which aim to inspire curiosity and fascination about the world and its people.

The geography curriculum at Paganel aims to develop the children's knowledge and understanding about the Earth's natural and human environments as well as key physical and human processes and the formation and use of landscapes and environments (including how these have changed over time). Paganel's geography curriculum also endeavours to provide fieldwork experiences to ensure children have the opportunities to collect, analyse and communicate with real life data to deepen their understanding of geographical processes. Furthermore, children will be given the chance to work with a range of geographical information such as maps, diagram, globes and aerial photographs and will use these forms to communicate their understanding as well.

Through the teaching of geography at Paganel Primary School it is hoped our children will develop a knowledge of the frameworks and approaches to support explanations of how the Earth's features are shaped, interconnected and changed over time. It is also hoped, by actively engaging with this subject area, that our children will be motivated and inspired to find out more about the world around them.
