There will be a prize for the most interesting entry from KS1, Lower KS2 and Upper KS2. We look forward to reading the children's amazing work!




Poetry comes in many forms and can be a great way to express yourself. Read this spoken word poem by one of our Year 6 pupils - perhaps it will inspire you!
