Year Group: 5 Topic: Ancient Egypt.

Prior knowledge

- Children have identified countries on a global map and investigated the impact of human features on landscapes.
- Children have researched the impact of significant individuals on the wider world, e.g. Martin Luther King Jr and the Civil Rights Movement.

Key Knowledge

- In 7,500 BC, the first settlers arrived in the Nile Valley.
- In 3,500 BC, hieroglyphics are used to keep trade records.
- In 2,640 BC, the first pyramid is built.
- In 2,555 BC, the Giza pyramids are built for the kings Kufu, Kharfe and Menkaure.
- In 2,520 BC, the Great Sphinx is built.
- In 1,539 BC, the Valley of the Kings starts and Pharaohs are buried with their treasures.
- In 1,332 BC, the 10 year rule of Tutankhamun begins.
- In 51 BC, Cleopatra's reign begins, the Egyptian civilisation ends.

Irrigation	A system of canals or channels
	Egyptians dug to supply water to
	grow crops over a larger area
	than the water would reach
	naturally.
Cartouche	An oval shape in which the
	names of kings and queens were
	often written in hieroglyphics to
	place on their tombs.
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Hieroglyphics	A system of writing that used
	pictures and symbols
	(hieroglyphs) instead of letters. It
	was often used for religious texts
	and inscriptions, as well as for
	counting taxes. Scribes had to go
	to a special school to learn how
	to read and write.
