Improved attainment and progress for PP children compared to National

# Target 1:

To support the teaching and learning by supporting children in smaller teaching groups in year 6

#### Impact:

The 60 children were taught every morning in groups of 20, by three experienced teachers. This allowed year 6 to focus on specific children. Progress in year 6 was strong in the summer particularly accelerated progress this was evident in book looks, learning walks and learning conversations with the children.

21-22 at Paganel attendance continued to massively impacted by the Pandemic, particularly Autumn and Spring terms.

Summer Term:

LEAVE IN TERM TIME: There has been 3 fines issued for leave in term so far.

FAST TRACK There has been 1 fine under the Fast track Process.

- 6 Families are on a Formal Warning.
- 9 Families are at SARM stage.
- 23 Families have received the Medical Proof required letter.
- 19 Families are being monitored.

## Target2:

To develop and support children's social, emotional and behavioural needs.

Impact: we have measured the impact of this through our behaviour logs. There has been a reduction in the number of behaviour logs throughout the year. The key children have been targeted after each monitoring period and the positive impact of this can be seen through behaviour reports.

## Target 3:

For children with emotional and behavioural difficulties to receive targeted intervention through family support.

Our FSW has worked with key families throughout the year, this has included parenting guidance, housing, accessing benefits. The impact can again be seen in some of the cases through the behaviour logs and progress made for these children.
