

Art and Culture Week 2022

Remembrance

For Art and Culture week this year, the children looked at the theme of Remembrance to coincide with Remembrance Day. The children spent the entire week participating in a range of activities where they learnt in greater depth about Remembrance Day, including, its origins, its significance within society and its link to British Values.

For Art, the children produced some wonderful pieces of art work inspired by poppies and used a range of mixed media to create their final pieces of work. The children's art work will be used as part of the school's Remembrance themed display which parents and carers will be able to see when they come into school.



In English, the children covered a variety of writing genres, from diary entries, setting descriptions, poems, telegrams and podcasts. The writing produced by the children was incredible and left their teachers amazed.

In addition to all of the activities planned by teaching staff, children in Year 2 to 6 were fortunate enough to experience workshops led by external visitors where the children were able to handle artefacts from the period, including wearing the uniform and helmets and soldiers from WWI. Years 5 and 6 used VR headsets to immerse themselves into life in the trenches which they thoroughly enjoyed.



To end Art and Culture week, each child from every class was asked to write a message of remembrance to form a Paganel Primary School Book of Remembrance which will be housed in the library and kept for future pupils, staff and visitors to read.
