Year Group: Year 2 Topic: The Great Fire of London

Prior knowledge - Year 1 knowledge which will support the children during this topic:

To understand the key parts of a story about a major historical figure.

To name and describe important places and landmarks.

To know what a significant individual did, and describe why they did it.

The ability to retell a past event from their own lives.

## **Key Knowledge developed during this topic:**

The four capital cities of the countries that make up the UK are London, Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast.

London in the 1600s was a very tough place to live, due to poverty, lack of education and disease. The Black Death was still killing people when the Great Fire took place.

The Great Fire is believed to have started in a bakery in Pudding Lane, and many things then contributed to it spreading – such as wooden buildings, strong winds and rubbish on the streets.

Much of London was destroyed and rebuilt, including famous buildings like St. Paul's Cathedral, Bridewall Palace, The Royal Exchange and Castle Baynard.

Much of what we know about the Great Fire is due to a diary written by Samuel Pepys.
