

- 3) I have £4.50 to spend. I buy a pack of A4 paper some scissors and a pencil. How much change do I get?
- 4) Is it cheaper for me to buy 100 single sheets of paper or a pack of A4 paper? What is the difference in price?
- 5) To the nearest pound, how much will it cost to buy a stapler and staples? Now add it up, were you right?
- 6) I treat myself to 100 sheets of A4 paper, pencil crayons, scissors, a rubber, a sharpener and one roll of sellotape. How much change will I get from £20?
- 7) Would £20 be enough money to buy one of each item from Mrs Gingell's shop?
